Mr. T. Pickering moved that a Potato Sprayer and two cases of chemical be purchased at a cost of £5.8/-

Mr. L. H. Ison seconded the resolution which was carried unanimously

It was resolved to charge as follows for the use of the sprayer
 For use of sprayer and provision of chemicals sufficient to spray the

potatoes twice 8^d per hundred for pieces of ground under an acre:

6^d per hundred for pieces of ground over an acre:

For use of sprays, uses to find out chemicals, 3^d per hour

It was decided that that the sprays and chemicals be in the case of Mr T. Pickering & whom all applications for the use of the sprays should be made

The Footpath Committee decided to inspect the stiles and the Cemetery Committee decided to inspect the cemetery

Bedding plants.

It was resolved on the motion of Messrs L. H. Ison and J. H. Pridgen to purchase a quantity of bedding plants for the cemetery.

On the motion of Messrs J. H. Pridgen and J. B. Hammersley a cheque for £5. 8^d was signed payable to the Food Production Society for the Potato Sprays.
