

Parish CouncilJuly - 7. 1919.

Present:— Messrs. J. B. Gammersley,
(Chair) J. Fletcher (vicar) T. G. Blake,
and J. F. Pridgeon, J. Meesons, and

The minutes of the last meeting
were read and signed by the chairman.

Mrs. T. Pickering was unable to be
present owing to illness.

The question of the Peace Celebrations
was discussed and it was decided
on the motion of Messrs. T. G. Blake
and L. H. Iron to spend the sum of
£60 in Peace Celebrations to provide a
tea to all children attending the day
schools, a meat tea for old people
over 65 years of age, and to entertain
all the discharged and demobilized sailors
and soldiers.

On the motion of Messrs. T. G. Blake
and J. F. Pridgeon it was unanimously
decided to engage the Horsham United
Silver Prize Band for the Peace Celebrations.

It was resolved that the
arrangements for the children's tea be
left in the hands of the Head Teachers
of the Schools, viz:— Mrs. Haskew,
Miss Grimley, and Mr. C. W. Pigham.

Lighting of Streets
 The lighting of the streets was discussed and it was decided on the motion of Messrs T. G. Blake and J. Measures and to make arrangements with the Measham Gas Co. to have lamps lighted as follows:— 1 in the middle of High St. opposite corner of Barnworth Road, 1 at the corner of Sweepstone Road, 1 at the corner of Moira Road, and 1 at the corner of Burton Road.

It was reported that the Measham Gas Co. would not be responsible for the lighting of more lamps than those mentioned.

Culvert On the motion of Mr. T. G. Blake seconded by Mr. J. Measures it was decided to request the District Council to have the ditch in Davis' Meadow cleaned out so that the sewage might be taken away from the culvert going under the Tamworth Road.

Land Salt
